


The WY Youth Offer





CASE STUDY – Kirklees Virtual Youth hub

A customer finished her university course where she studied Law and came out with a 2:1 in July 2019. She'd expected that she would be able to get a job in that sector but found it hard, possibly because she hadn't done a placement as part of the course.

She was looking for any work, but coming up against the same wall a lot of people meet in this situation – overqualified for "A Job". She had become disenchanted and frustrated.

She was also having to spend some time looking after her mum who was sick and shielding under Covid-19 regulations. She felt it would be difficult to find work because she lived with her mum and didn't want to take Covid home with her. This was affecting her mental health, although she felt she wasn't ill, just "down".

We got support through our Youth Hub Partner, C&K Careers through the Works Better programme. With this additional support, we were able to move to work on motivating the customer, keeping her focused and building her resilience.

We had some Kickstart placements at Huddersfield University, where the customer had studied, and she applied for some of them.

She was applying again and being more positive, despite personal setbacks. We kept the motivation up and the customer told us she had an interview with Huddersfield University, with a local law firm, and with Kirklees Council. We worked on positivity – seeing herself in the interview and able to answer each question confidently.

She was offered a Kickstart job with Huddersfield University and was delighted!



Why your Youth Outreach Hub is important

The coronavirus Covid-19 pandemic has delivered a major shock to the country's economy. During the early weeks of the pandemic, our priority in DWP was wholly focused on ensuring that financial support was provided to those who needed it – with excellent results in West Yorkshire. While this remains our priority we are now working hard to re-start our labour market activity in what is an unprecedented environment, especially for our young people. No doubt this will bring challenges, however success will come by harvesting the influence of our partners to collaboratively bring about an attraction campaign for the young people and employers.

With a weak economy and high competition we are aware that young people are likely to be disproportionately impacted by the pandemic – they are more likely to be working in sectors that have shut down and those entering the labour market for the first time will not have access to the same opportunities as before. Those 18 to 24 year olds that were unemployed or already vulnerable in the labour market, prior to COVID19, will be further disadvantaged having no work experience and for some, no qualifications. Young people will be a key priority for DWP and that is why the pace to develop and implement a Youth Outreach Hub is extremely important.

Youth Hubs work collaboratively with our local community and partner organisations who specialise in the wellbeing and support of young people and who will raise awareness of the support available, how they can access it. We want to create opportunities within the Hub bringing together all our partners in a common goal for young people to help, support and engage to move them closer to or into work, apprenticeships or education
